HEALTH CARE PROCEDURE/MEDICAL FORMS UPDATE

EDC have updated their Health Care procedure for schools and there are new forms to complete should medicine require to be administered during the school day. This applies to prescribed and non-prescribed medicine. The new form (9/06/F01) has been sent along with this newsletter and will also be added to the school website if you want to print off the form in advance. Alternatively, you can complete a paper copy from the school office. Please see below for some key points to be aware of when bringing any medication to school:

- Parents/carers are responsible for supplying information about medicines that need to be taken in school and for letting the school know of any changes to the prescription or the support needed.
- School staff cannot administer prescribed or non-prescribed medication to any pupil without Form 9/06/F01.
- Prescribed medication will only be accepted in the original packaging where it states:
 - The prescribed pupil's name
 - Name of medication
 - Instructions for administration to the named pupil



• An adult must always be responsible for bringing any medication to school and for collecting it at the end of the school day. School staff cannot not return medication to a child.

Children and young people with longer term, complex healthcare or targeted medical support needs or children with underlying health conditions that require an emergency response may require more detailed planning and co-ordination and this should be managed by using an individual school Healthcare Plan or a Pupil Emergency Procedure Plan. Mrs Doherty will be in contact with parents to complete these for any pupils who require them.

ATTENDANCE

Good attendance at school is important to ensure that children and young people meet their full potential and it is a requirement that attendance is reviewed by the school regularly as part of monitoring and tracking. Communication between home and school is always key and we think that it is important that parents are informed when their child's absence levels reach a stage where it could be impacting on their child's learning and his/her ability to reach his/her full potential.

Research shows that attendance of 95% or above gives learners the best of chance of success. At 90% attendance (19 days of absence over the school year) learners could drop a whole grade in secondary while attendance below 90% could have serious implications for learning and progress with attendance of 85% (27 days) meaning that nearly half a school term has been missed.

Please do not hesitate to contact the school if you wish to speak to a member of the Leadership Team about your child's attendance or wellbeing at any time. Parents can check their child's attendance at any time through the Parents Portal. Please contact the office if you need to help to access this.

LEARNING IN PE THIS TERM



This session in PE pupils will be developing their skills in Gymnastics during their indoor PE sessions. To ensure the health and safety of all pupils, please make sure that your child has suitable footwear and that long hair is tied up and that, as always in line with EDC policy, no jewellery is worn.

Please remember that on outside PE days, school uniform tops/jumpers should still be worn to school but that jogging trousers/leggings can be worn instead of school trousers/skirts. Please remember that this is just in place for PE days and that normal school uniform should be worn on all non-PE days. Please also remember that no football colours should be worn as per EDC policy. If anyone is in need of any school uniform replacements please remember that we have a Uniform Swap Shop in place and you can contact Mrs Mulvee-Donnelly directly on <u>smulvee-donnelly@meadowburn.e-dunbarton.sch.uk</u> and she can advise what items/sizes are currently available.
