



On a Friday, children can bring in a toy from home to play with in class.


If the children lose golden time they will be given the chance to earn this back throughout the week.

- an effective contributor





Issued on MONDAY and to be returned on a FRIDAY

- New sounds will be given home as your child learns the initial sounds, usually 3 sounds peweek.
- Encourage your child to talk about the sound the letter makes and to practise the actio the sound.
- Children will be given common words as well as the sounds taught.
- Discuss the words on the sounds sheet and practise writing the letter a few times in the homework jotter.
- Later in the session one piece of maths homework per week to reinforce number format recognition and counting.
- Reading words and sounds will be sent home to practise.
- There will be no reading books home initially however it is beneficial for your child to have stories read to them on a regular basis whether it be inGaelic or English.
- Look at different genres, discuss the front cover, author, title and what it might be about.


- In the event of an absence, please phone the school as near to 9:00am as possible. If not done before 9.30 then the office will phone home.
