
- I.C.T on a Wednesday after break

Reading will be taught through strategies such as reciprocal reading, silent reading and reading groups

We will be teaching the *reading tools* used to decode unfamiliar and tricky words, as well as comprehension skills to ensure children have an understanding of what they are reading.

SPELLING



C4 starting English next week

Clas 4 and 5 will get English and Gaelic spelling words for homework every week

Active spelling tasks will be used to help the children reinforce their spelling words.

V.C.O.P -- **B.C.F.P**

- The children will continue to use this method which focuses on the importance of vocabulary, connectives, openers and punctuation in writing.
- Pupils have found this broken down method of remembering what is expected of them very successful in attaining their full potential.
- The children will also be developing their ability to assess and edit their own and others writing. This will be done through AiFL (Assessment is for learning).

MATHS

Classwork will continue to take an active, collaborative approach with the use of ICT and concrete materials to support and extend learning.

- Place Value: ordering and rounding numbers to 100,000.
- Addition and subtraction: performing mental and written calculations with larger numbers.
- Multiplication: developing mental skills e.g. 56x3 = 50x3 + 6x3 = 168.
 Reinforcing the 6. 7. 8 and 9 times tables. Everyday the children will practice their timetables to ensure they are confident in them.
- Division: using a written method to divide up to 4 and 5 digit numbers with and without remainders.
- Fractions, Decimals & Percentages: Continuing to simplify and find equivalent fractions. Finding fractions of a quantity.
- Time: Durations. Times before and after bridging the hour.
- Money: Recognise all notes and coins to £20. Finding totals and change mentally up to £20. Convert pence to pounds.


